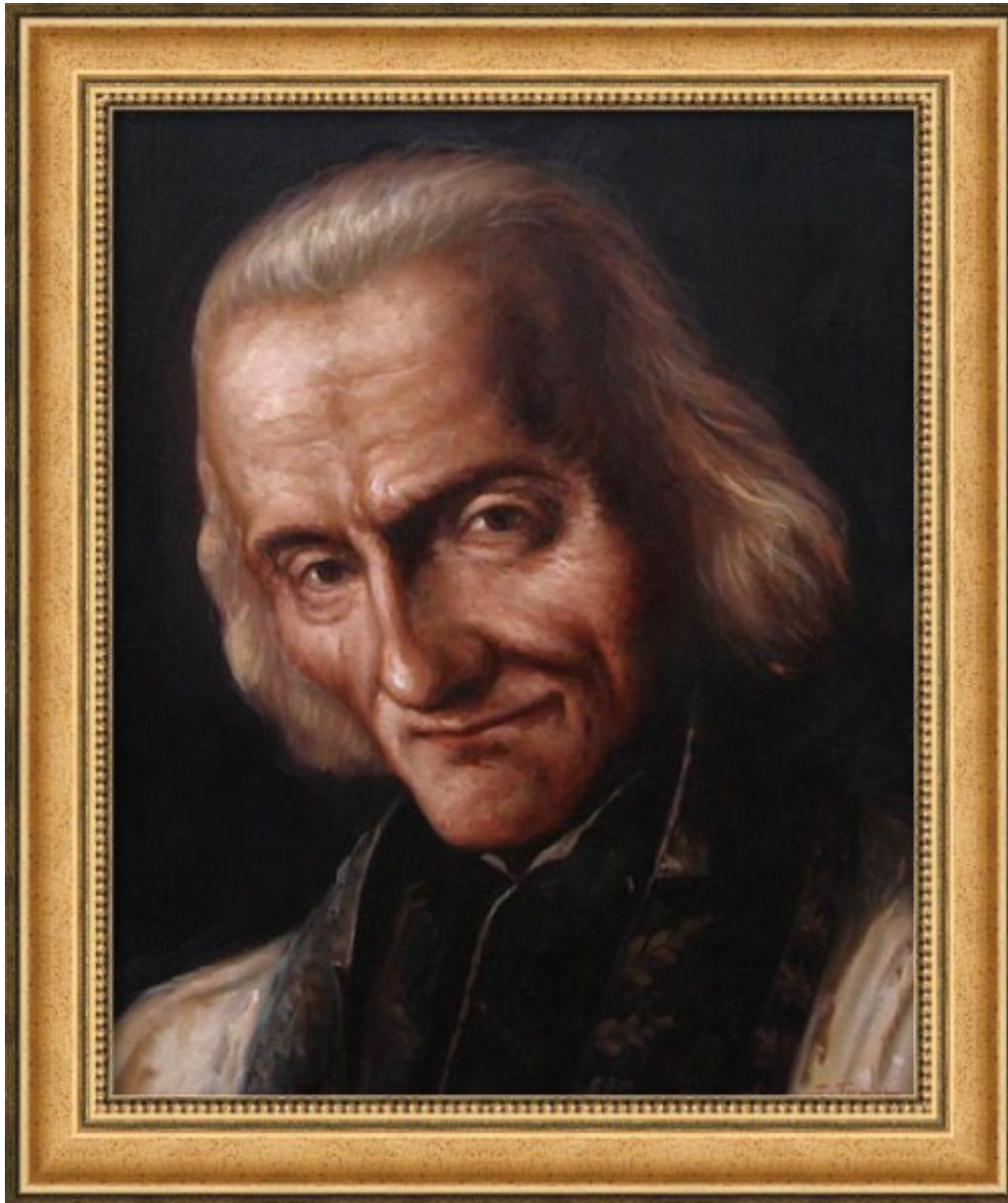

COMMUNION FAST

When planning to receive Communion at Mass, we are reminded that, out of reverence and respect for the Body and Blood of Christ which we receive in the Eucharist, the Church's Code of Canon Law (919) states that *"One who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion"*.

Sacrament of the Sick

In the event of a serious illness or a medical emergency, Monsignor Baird should be contacted immediately so that the Sacraments of the Church may be celebrated.

Funerals

At the death of a loved one, please notify Monsignor Baird so that a date and time for the Funeral Liturgy may be arranged.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Registration and preparation are required. Please contact the parish office six months in advance of desired wedding date. At least one member of the engaged couple must be a practicing Catholic and a member of the Chapel at least one year prior to the wedding date.

Baptisms

Baptisms are *usually* scheduled for the first Sunday of every month. Sacramental preparation is requested for parents and Godparents. A Godparent must be a practicing and confirmed Catholic and, if married, married in the Church.
